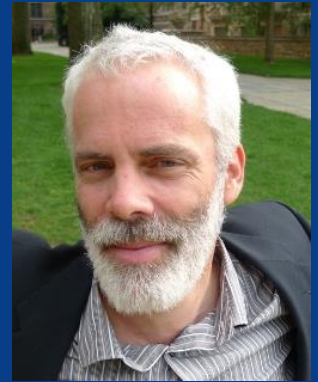
Interpreting and Parsing Sluicing

Interpreting a sluice requires copying a scope remnant from earlier discourse.
(1) John talked to someone, but I don't know [who ~~John talked to~~].

I argue that finding a sluice interpretation requires additional computational effort beyond what is otherwise required for ordinary scope-taking and anaphora.
